It gives me great pleasure to inform you that the following property;

Buckley's Addition Historic District

Roughly bounded by n Steele, N 8th, N Pine & N 21st Streets, Tacoma

has been listed in the National Register of Historic Places, where it joins other properties which contribute to the rich cultural heritage of Washington State. The Buckley's Addition Historic District is historically significant as a cohesive neighborhood that represents the broad pattern of the social and economic history of Tacoma, and serves as a typical street-car suburb of the early 20th century. The district is also significant for its collection of homes built in Tacoma from 1890 to 1941. Many of these dwellings represent the work of a master craftsmen and/or architects, and a majority of the resources possess high artistic values representing significant characteristics of styles popular during the late 19th and early 20th centuries.

The National Register records the tangible reminders of the history of the United States and is the official repository for documentation of cultural resources worthy of preservation.
