There is a pair of narrow windows (two-over-one) situated in the larger gable face. On the main wall to the left of the entrance is a large four-over-one windows. To the right of the entrance porch on the side wind of the house is a large picture window. The main entrance door is flanked by two narrow windows. There is a chimney to the far right. the house is clad with wood shingle in an alternating wide and narrow pattern.
