NORTH END STRATEGY NORTH SLOPE PLAN


At our last meeting we received a briefing from James Matthews, Tacoma City Planning and Development Services on the North End Action Strategy(see Box) Now that we have had a couple of months to think about it, time has come to provide your input to our own North Slope Action Plan for inclusion in the City's North Action Plan. The last time such a Strategy/Plan was developed city wide was in 1981 and the North Slope Plan was one of the few neighborhood plans included therein. Our neighborhood benefited considerably from it. Now may be your last opportunity for another 17 years to provide input on what you would like your neighborhood to be. Our December meeting will include a short talk on some specifics things included in our Plan to this point. What is a Neighborhood Action Strategy:

A "to do" list of recommended actions for the maintenance and improvement of a given neighborhood. This list will build on the base established by Tacoma's Comprehensive Plan. This strategy is intended to become a working program that reflects neighborhood priorities balanced with citywide responsibilities.

Sample "TO DO" List

- Add small parks, bike lanes and trail system that build on the assets of the North End.
- Add new policies to better guide future planning and development in our area.
- Adjustment to design of intersections(like adding left turn lanes)
- Cleaning up remaining pockets of unimproved street right-ofways.

ANNOBEE UPDATE


The Annobee Apartments was purchased by two local investors in July 1998. They started negotiations a number of years ago before finally obtaining the property. The new owners plan to restore the Annobee over the next several years. They will renovate the current building and focus on attracting retired persons.

Currently the new owners are in the process of placing the property on the National Register of Historical Places. Nomination is expected to happen by early spring. After such time, the new owners will finish lining up their funding sources and begin construction in summer of 1999 and complete approximately one year later. The property's exterior will not be significantly altered, but the interior will be completely renovated. The Annobee will contain 42 studio and one-bedroom units, which is a slight reduction from the current count. The first units are expected to be available for renting in the spring of 2000.

GRAFFITI PLAN TO BE INTRODUCED

Tacoma Council Member - Kevin Phelps will provide information at our next meeting Dec. 5th on his plan to help eliminate the problem of graffiti in our neighborhoods and business districts. Mr. Phelps has been working with the City staff, Tacoma police and Safe Streets to create a comprehensive approach to eliminating this continual problem. The goal of the program is to have **OUICK** and PERSISTENT removal of graffiti. The plan will involve support from: The City of Tacoma, Safe Streets, the Tacoma Police, the Juvenile Rehabilitation Program and Reman Hall. Each will have specific responsibilities that will save property owners over \$200,000 each year. Additionally, the expectation is that each of our city's neighborhood groups and business districts will work with the four partners, thus creating a community based approach to graffiti eradication
