NSHD Historic Celebration

About 90 guests celebrated our National Historic designation on a hot 90 degree day, June 7, at Jay & Julie Turner's house. Mayor Baarsma presented a certificate of appreciation to Jay for his leadership in



historic preservation, and a framed print, signed and numbered by Sara Clementson of the "Three Domes of Tacoma," to both the Turners.

Michael Houser, Architectural Historian at the Washington Office of Archaeology and Historic Preservation in Olympia, explained the significance of historic designation. He mentioned the seven other Tacoma sites that have national designation: Old City Hall, South J Street, Stadium-Seminary, Wright Park, Union Depot Warehouse, Brown's Point, and Camp Six.

Jay spoke about the historic project, and the next mission---zoning!

The North Slope has plaques available for attaching to front door areas. The engraved brass plaques cost \$50 and may be ordered from Ralph Tomberg. (See article on pg 2.)

The NHSD Steering Committee has a zoning committee which is working on writing a new zoning category for residential historic districts. This category would be applicable to the NHSD neighborhood and to any other neighborhoods placed on the Tacoma Historic Register.




North Slope Tea Party & Tour

North Slope Historic District Plaque For Individual Homes

The NSHD Steering Committee has arranged for the manufacture of brass plaques for individual homes within the North Slope Historic District to perpetually recognize the District's new status as being on the National Register of Historic Places. The pictured plaque is cast of solid brass and will be a permanent symbol indicating your home's status as a contributing historic property. Plaques cost \$50.00 each, including shipping, when ordered in lots of 25 or more, or may be ordered individually at a cost of \$84.10 each. An order will be submitted when at least 25 people have signed up and paid for their plaque. Checks should be made out to the North Slope Historic District and will not be processed until an order is submitted to the manufacturer.

FROM THE ARCHIVES

of the National Historic Register

The North Slope has had two Hollywood stars living here during their childhood.

Bing Crosby's father, Harry Crosby, was a bookkeeper and county treasurer. The American Foursquare house at 1112 North J was built in 1902. The facade is dominated by a flat roofed covered porch supported on

paired turned columns. The front windows are not original but the external siding is. Bing was born there



in 1903, and moved to Spokane three years later. His 100th birthday was celebrated last May 3.

The George Millers lived at 914 North M in the 1930s and 40s. He was vice-president of Winthrop Motor Company. Their daughter, Marjie, won a Shirley Temple look-a-like contest in 1935, and moved to Hollywood in 1950 to pursue modeling, radio, television, and movies. She changed the spelling of her last name to Millar. This craftsman bungalow built in 1925 has a brick chimney centered at the roof ridge. The porch is supported on round tapered columns and the siding is entirely clad in wood shingles.


