Protect Yourself

In early June, the *News Tribune* reported about a scheme in which a group of burglars was using a youth to check on whether anyone was inside Key Peninsula homes they wanted to raid. The article quoted Pierce County Sheriff's deputies who said the group drives around checking for homes that appear to be vacant. They then send the youth to the front door. If there's no answer, the group burglarizes the place. If someone answers, the youth makes an excuse for having the wrong address and leaves.

A similar tactic was employed in May at a residence on North 5th Street. The effort failed and the resident reported the incident. A neighbor called 911 when a similar group was seen in the

same area. Further, both NW Kinetics buildings were broken into during the same time period; nothing was taken.

Be aware. If you suspect any sort of criminal activity in your neighborhood, call 911 immediately.

Policing the Neighborhood

Eleven Tacoma police officers are designated as

Community Liaison Officers serving four different sectors within the city. The North Slope Historic District falls within Sector Two, which is served by two Community Liaison Officers who provide specialized services to our citizens and businesses, and




