## The North Slope is Wired

### Washington's 1<sup>st</sup> Female Architect

Tacoma's premier architects built the North Slope, and many lived here as well: Russell (1222 N. 4th), Sutton (301 N. I), Darmer (520 N. L), Bullard (523 N. J), Blair (524 N. Cushman), Borhek (715 N. Sheridan), and Heath (several locations). However, one of our historic district's crown jewels is the modest house at 1012 North 9th, built in 1887-88 for \$1,200. It is one of only two remaining houses that we know were designed by Kate Lockwood Squire, Washington's first woman architect.

Squire is a mystery. We know little about her or where she received her training. She was the architect for the Tacoma Building and Savings Association (TBSA), which was similar to a "savings and loan" of today. Building associations were the way most working and middle class homes were built at this time. Squire worked for the TBSA only 6 months but designed 28 buildings in Tacoma, mostly modest houses. Only 1012 North 9th and another at 1010 South 7th remain. Between 1889 and 1890, TBSA also built 920, 924, 1212 and 1214 North I, but we don't know if Squire's plans were involved.

Squire arrived in Tacoma in 1887, just as the building boom began. She may have been married to F.O. Squire, but the city directory has them living separately. Suddenly in 1888 a brief newspaper notice appeared saying she had left for California for her "husband's health." No other information has been located about her. Tacoma was a bustling frontier town. People came and went, and no one asked too many questions.

K. Lockwood Squire can keep her mystery, and we will preserve her legacy.

# Call Before You Hammer

Exterior changes to your house or garage, other than painting and minor repair, must be reviewed by the Tacoma Landmarks Commission. This includes:

- changing or replacing windows.
- changing siding.
- adding, replacing or changing a porch or deck.
