The city of Tacoma is offering free street trees to property owners through April 2010. The catch is that the minimum number of trees that can be ordered is 10.

Call Before You Hammer

Exterior changes to your house or garage, other than painting and minor repairs, must be reviewed by the Tacoma Landmarks Commission. This includes:

- Changing or replacing windows
- Changing siding
- Adding, replacing or changing a porch or deck.

Before starting any exterior work, contact Reuben McKnight, our city Historic Preservation Officer, at 591-5220 or Reuben.McKnight@ci.tacoma.wa.us He can tell you if your project needs a design review and how to proceed if it does.

Celebrate 100 This Fall

Our friends at Immanuel Presbyterian Church, who continue their long- standing support of the North Slope



Historic District, will be having a 100-year celebration starting in September.

While the Immanuel congregation was formed in 1888, its distinctive Spanish Mission-style sanctuary at 901 North J Street was completed in April 1909, under the direction of prominent local architect Ambrose Russell. The church building is a part of the North Slope Historic District.

The Centennial Celebration will kick off with a musical extravaganza in the sanctuary and a Chocolate Social on Sunday, September 27, beginning at 6 pm.

A spiritual pilgrimage through the sanctuary and church building will take place on Saturday, October 3, from 10-11 a.m.

The big celebration will be a special Centennial worship service on Sunday, October 4, at 10:30 a.m., followed by a celebratory luncheon. Then, on Sunday the 5th at 5pm, the church will host a special Blues Vespers, featuring Bill Sims Jr. to raise funds for the Peacemaking Program of PCUSA.

Immanuel invites neighbors and friends to join their celebration. The sanctuary was renovated over the summer and the community is welcome to attend all events.

Call the Abandoned Auto Hotline

The City of Tacoma offers an Abandoned Auto Hotline which allows citizens to report vehicles that they believe to be abandoned. The Hotline number is **(253) 591-5926** and is available 24 hours a day, seven days a week.

Tacoma Municipal Code Section 11.05.230 prohibits parking or storage of any type of vehicle on City right of way for more than 7 days. An abandoned vehicle is a vehicle that has been left on city streets for an extended period and may have one or more of the following conditions.

- Is unused or inoperable
- In a state of disrepair
- Major components missing
- Has flat tires
- Has expired or missing license plates

Prevent Street Flooding

Each year, Tacoma gets about 40 inches of rain, with nearly 4 inches of it falling within just 24 hours. When that much rain comes down that fast – the City's stormwater system can get overwhelmed and some city streets and low areas can flood.

What can you do about street flooding? If your street is flooding, it is usually caused by a storm drain that is covered with leaves, plastic bags or other debris.

The City Streets and Grounds department suggests using a rake, broom or blower to regularly remove debris from the street storm drain grate near your home or business. With more than 17,000 storm drains to manage, the City can't get to them all during heavy rains – citizens must do their part.

If the storm drain in your street is clear and there is still street flooding, call the City Sewer Utility Department at (253) 591-5585.
