# Required: Driver's license or recent utility bill to prove residency

Owners and renters of single-family houses and duplexes who live in the NSHD are invited to unload unwanted items for **FREE**.

Accepted items include non-working electronics (e.g., TV's, computers, monitors, appliances, vacuum cleaners, etc.), lawn equipment (empty fluids), tires, carpet, furniture, exercise equipment (e.g., bikes, skis, treadmills, etc.), barbecues (no propane tanks), strollers, metals.

Unaccepted items include daily household garbage that fits in your green trash bin, recyclables that fit in your blue recycle bin, yard and food waste, sod, hazardous materials including their containers, liquids, roofing materials, hot water heaters, cars/motorcycles/RV's/campers/truck

canopies/trailers/boats/riding lawn mowers or vehicle parts, concrete, bricks, rocks, dirt, animal carcasses, items from apartment buildings, businesses or construction sites.

## Call Before You Hammer

Exterior changes to your house or garage, other than painting and minor repairs, must be reviewed by the Tacoma Landmarks Commission. This includes:

- Changing or replacing windows
- Changing siding
- Adding, replacing or changing a porch or deck.



Before starting any exterior work, contact Reuben McKnight, our city Historic Preservation Officer, at 591-5220 or Reuben.McKnight@ci.tacoma.wa.us He can tell you if your project needs a design review and how to proceed if it does.

### 2011 Tour of Homes! April 30th

This year's Tacoma Historical Society Tour of Homes features three homes in the North Slope Historic District, plus three homes on North 30th Street, Jason Lee Middle School, First Evangelical Lutheran Church (524 South I St.), and First Church of Christ, Scientist (902 Division Ave).

The 2011 Tour of Homes is on Saturday, April 30, from 10 am to 5 pm, and Sunday, May 1, from 1 pm to 5 pm. Tickets can be purchased at Stadium Thriftway, the Pacific Northwest Shop, and the Fircrest, Pearl Street, and Union Ave. branches of Columbia Bank. Tickets can also be purchased on the weekend of the tour at First Evangelical Lutheran Church, which is both on the tour and serving as the Tour of Homes reception center. Tickets are \$20 each (\$15 for Tacoma Historical Society members).

North Slope homes have been frequently featured on the Home Tour. And many North Slope residents participate as docents. This year's North Slope homes are diverse, and are typical of the diversity of styles found throughout the district: the Queen Anne style home at 414 N. J St., the Craftsman style bungalow at 1302 North 8th St., and the Foursquare style home at 1208 North I St. Call Jim Hoard with questions, 253-272-7222

### What Do NSHD Historic Designations Mean?

The Washington State Heritage Register and the National Register of Historic Places are official lists of places important to the history of our state and nation. These honors are given to neighborhoods and buildings deemed worthy of preservation. About 1600 places in Washington are listed on the state and the national registers.

The Tacoma Register of Historic Places falls under a city ordinance administered by the Landmarks Commission, with guidelines based on those required by the National Park Service for the National Register. The ordinance includes protections for individual properties against exterior alterations that would degrade the structure's historic architectural integrity.

Our neighborhood of 900-1000 properties is included under all three registers; in addition, several individual homes in NSHD are on the registers as individual properties.

#### What is the zoning category of our neighborhood?

In 2006, the Tacoma City Council passed an ordinance forming a new zoning category that had been requested by the North Slope Historic District. This new zoning category was called Historic Mixed-Residential Special Review District, or HMR-SRD and was a single-family zone based on the requirements for the R2-SRD category. The new zone was designed for neighborhoods on Tacoma's Register and incorporated the protections from demolition contained in the Historic District ordinance, as well as protections from conversion of single-family homes to multiple units.

The new zoning category made the neighborhood safer from demolition of historic buildings to build large apartment units, since an historic district is just an overlay on top of the underlying zoning category. Now, we have a zoning category specifying single-family homes, as well as an overlay indicating historic value.
