

Join us for the North Slope's Annual July 4th Parade



Children of all ages are invited to participate in the North Slope's Fourth Annual Fourth of July Kiddie Parade beginning at Noon on Monday, July 4. Participants should gather beginning at 11:45 a.m. at the corner of N. 12th and N. J streets, near Saint Patrick's Catholic Church.

Once everyone has assembled, we'll call upon parents and spectators to help carefully move our parade participants down J Street to N. 8th. At 8th, we'll turn right and travel one more block to the North Slope Park.

All modes of non-motorized transportation are allowed: You can walk, jump rope, bike, rollerblade, skateboard ... younger residents may want to catch a ride in a stroller or wagon. If you play an instrument, bring it! Decorations and patriotic apparel are encouraged. The North Slope will provide free stick flags to participants. Well-behaved pets on leashes are welcome. We also need lots of spectators to line the route.

A prize will be awarded for the best float. Gather your friends and neighbors to create a non-motorized (yes, that means it will be powered by you!) float that speaks to the spirit of the holiday.

At the park, following the parade, we'll have donation containers; we hope you might consider donating a few

dollars to help the non-profit North Slope Historic District with costs associated with this event, neighborhood beautification and the publication of this newsletter.

We Cleaned Up Big Time!

Tacoma Community Based Services, Immanuel Presbyterian Church, and the North Slope Historic District, Inc. joined forces to clean up the district this month. Nearly 13% of the NSHD property owners and residents (107 of the 847 qualifying Tacoma Solid Waste customers) took advantage of the free service and discarded nearly 13 tons of garbage and recyclables (i.e., metals, tires, and refrigerators)! In addition, participants filled up a Goodwill truck with resaleable items. CBS surprised us by arranging for 4 Code Compliance Officers to help us collect garbage, a Community Service Supervisor and a crew of 5 workers to help us offload garbage into dumpsters, 2 Police Officers to issue parking tickets and warnings, and a street sweeper to clean up Immanuel Presbyterian's parking lot afterwards. Join me in thanking Allyson Griffith of CBS for directing the attention of all of these services to our neighborhood on June 11th!

Community Based Services' mission is as much about building community as it is about cleaning up Tacoma's neighborhoods. Many volunteers contributed their time, vehicles, muscles and culinary talents to this cleanup including Geoff Corso, Julie Turner, Marshall McClintock, John Butler, Mike and Marilynn Sabo, Mitch Robinson, Patrick and Martha Mendenhall, Bill Connolly, Diane Mikhlin, Don England, Wanda Rochelle, and Kathy Martin. These neighborhood volunteers brought this free service to the NSHD and made it happen. Thank you volunteers!

Call Before You Hammer

Exterior changes to your house or garage, other than painting and minor repairs, must be reviewed by the Tacoma Landmarks Commission. This includes:

- Changing or replacing windows
- Changing siding
- Adding, replacing or changing a porch or deck.



Before starting any exterior work, contact Reuben McKnight, our city Historic Preservation Officer, at 591-5220 or Reuben.McKnight@ci.tacoma.wa.us. He can tell you if your project needs a design review and how to proceed if it does.



Reporting Non-Emergency Issues to Police.

It's been a while since this contact information was distributed. There are always some questions about how to report non-emergencies to the police in the most appropriate manner. Here is a quick synopsis.

Examples of non-emergency issues include:

- Minor vandalism
- Illegally parked cars
- Vehicles with expired tabs in the city right-of-way
- Motorists driving over curbs
- Commercial vehicles parked on the street overnight
- Noise pollution

Using your computer: Instructions

- In your browser's Uniform Resource Locator (URL) field, type:



- Read the instructions on the screen.
- Click on the map where the issue or concern exists.
- Type:
 - Your name.
 - Your address.
 - A description of the problem.
 - The address of the problem.
 - The way you want the police to resolve the problem.
 - Your phone number.
 - Your email address.
- Select the way that you prefer to be contacted by the police.
- Press the "Submit Your Report Now" button.

NOTE: The police don't respond to non-emergency issues until all of their emergency work is complete. Consequently, the police may not address your non-emergency issue promptly or even at all. If your issue hasn't been addressed after a week, report it again. Be persistent.
